Community Policing Events/Programs:

Despite scheduling around summer vacations the officers handled 79 additional calls for service. The officers continue to work hard to protect the citizens of Hubbardston.

I am happy to announce that we have not had to use the Narcan as of yet, but we have it and are trained to respond with it.

Officers are continuing to stop and visit several locations where residents gather, such as the Skate Park, playground, and flea market. They are working hard to maintain open lines of communication with the community.

Due to several complaints of speeding throughout town patrols have increased radar set up in an attempt to slow the motoring public.

We continue to advise Facebook followers of scams, road construction and news of interest. In regards to social media we have increased our followers on Facebook from 1477 to 1510 and Twitter from 2003 to 2047. The feedback continues to be extremely positive and followers continue to grow.

Budget Information/Concerns:

We continue to deal with the loss of a full time officer. At this time plans are ongoing for a replacement. The part time officers, as well as full-timers, have worked extra to bridge the gap. Despite this I am within budget.

Equipment and Capital Equipment needs/Concerns:

The 2013 Police Interceptor continues to creep towards 100,000 miles at 88000. The 2007 Explorer is almost at 90000 miles and the 2011 Crown Victoria is at 105000. The maintenance costs have been minor to this point but I expect an increase in these costs with the age of the vehicles. The transmission continues to slip on the 2007 Explorer.

Personnel Information:

The current personnel continue to fill shifts and work the required details for road projects. The morale continues to be excellent and officers have been working well together.

There were no grant opportunities this month.


Records:
