Community Policing Events/Programs:

Officers continue to man the crossing when possible at both start and dismissal times. Their presence has slowed travel in the area during these critical times and added a layer of safety. We recently purchased a speed warning sign that will be placed on Main St. by November.

We continue to maintain radar posts at strategic/problem areas of town. As we receive complaints regarding speeders we are very responsive to the needs of the community.

The Hubbardston Police had a major presence at the Halloween parade and Halloween festivities. Special thanks to CERT for their help at the crosswalks. The Police Department donated reusable glow lights at the

PTO party on the 30th and officers gave them out on Halloween. They were a big hit and a great safety tool.

We continue to advise Facebook followers of scams, road construction and news of interest. In regards to social media we have increased our followers on Facebook from 1573 to 1602 and Twitter from 2162 to 2230. The feedback continues to be extremely positive and followers continue to grow.

Budget Information/Concerns:

We continue to deal with the loss of a full time officer but Officer Dominic Walker continues to take the open overnight shifts until he can go to the academy as a self-sponsor in February. This will save the town money regarding his academy fees and pay.

Equipment and Capital Equipment needs/Concerns:

The 2013 Police Interceptor continues to creep towards 100,000 miles at 97500. The 2007 Explorer is at 88500 miles and the 2011 Crown Victoria is at 117000. The maintenance costs in October included light bar parts for the 2001 Crown Victoria as well as work on the electrical system..

I have completed my Capital requests for FY17 and have requested replacement of both the 2011 Crown Victoria and the 2007 Explorer.

The current personnel continue to fill shifts and work the required details for road projects. The morale is excellent and officers have been working well together.

There were no grant opportunities this month.


Records:
